THE AMERICAN HEALTH CARE ACT WITHDRAWN PRIOR TO HOUSE VOTE

Executive Summary

- On March 24, 2017, Speaker of the House Paul Ryan announced that the American Health Care Act (AHCA) was withdrawn from the House of Representatives, meaning the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) remains unchanged.
- The American Health Care Act was a proposed health care bill that would have repealed and replaced parts of the ACA.
- Employers and individuals should continue to ensure they remain in compliance with the current ACA regulations.

As published in our informational Breaking News piece, released on March 10, 2017, the American Health Care Act (AHCA) was a **proposed bill** designed to repeal and replace portions of the ACA. This bill was sent to the House of Representatives which was slated to be voted on in the House today.

Today, March 24, 2017, Speaker of the House Paul Ryan announced the AHCA had been withdrawn from consideration on the House floor. Since AHCA was not passed, the ACA remains unchanged. Therefore, employers and individuals should continue to ensure they remain in compliance with the current ACA regulations.

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
